Whether the challenges relate to the keeping the church going to keeping faith with our commitment to build a world where justice, kindness and a safe future are a universal experience, we have a job to do.

2024 Parish Council Report for AGM

Your Parish Council has met monthly, providing an oversight of the activities of all the different groups that meet and work in the Parish. The first thing I want to say about Parish Council is that it never stands still. Of course we have routine meetings, where the primary business is ‘business as usual’. Equally, though, we have meetings where we have to make very significant decisions.

A prime example of these decisions we have had to make is with regard to insurance. Questions are being raised about the structure of Parish Council from within and outside the council.

We have not been afraid to address these issues. If the desired changes seem slow to materialise it is worth remembering that we are not so much young and impetuous as experienced and thoughtful!

We want to make sure that any changes are sustainable and not an unrealistic burden on a congregation already working at full capacity.

A decision has been made to establish an oversight group with responsibility for the Raumati complex and affairs. Waikanae Church has such a committee and it makes a big difference to the effective running of matters which are specific to Waikanae.

Another structural change under discussion is how to regularise our system of voting people onto Parish Council and how long should the term be. As well as this there have been questions about how many people we need on Parish Council to ensure that it is functional, effective, and sufficiently representative.

These questions will be opened up for discussion at the Annual Meeting. Everyone present will have the opportunity to share their ideas. Whether they are set out in the form of a proposal or contributions based on other experiences of Parish Councils or simply suggestions.

Parish Council is a reporting body as well as a policy and decision making body. These are all functions of our governing responsibilities. We received reports about the decision to commission a new cross for the Raumati Church, the decision to close the Waikanae Church Playgroup, decisions relating to the management of Thrifty Place, and our church properties' maintenance, management of our finances, plans for the 40th anniversary, new signage, changes in leadership of committees such as pastoral, the provision of social opportunities, suggested activities which may be controversial... It's a long list.

Some of these required actions on the part of PC, and not simply discussion. Some of them happen every month and others are one off.

The smooth running of the day to day life of the churches owes a lot to the competence and efficiency of our office administrator who is employed by Parish Council. On your behalf I would like to thank Fiona for going the extra mile time and again to ensure things get done in a timely manner. I would also like to thank Kate for her ready help when Fiona takes a much-deserved break.

Cathy Drummond, our Treasurer, is another Parish Council employee who goes above and beyond the paper definition of her role. She has done a wonderful job helping us to make ends meet under difficult circumstances where our budget is concerned.

Thank you to Sasha for doing such a good job running playgroup and also taking over some of the tasks which Dorothy did for many years as part of her contribution to the ministry of the Parish.

Thanks also to Jack who carries out several maintenance and housekeeping jobs around the Raumati church and Thrifty Place.

I hope you will all join me in saying a heartfelt ‘Well Done’ to all our councillors, Mary, Ken, Marie, Bruce, Carole, Maureen, Barrie, Evan, Cathy and Merrill.

And finally, a big Thank You to Jan, our Parish Secretary, a tireless and dedicated member of Parish Council ...

2024 Social Opportunities Report

This time last year we welcomed the presence of our Fijian friends into our Parish. This welcome was combined with a delicious Sunday Roast enjoyed by all. We repeated the meal as part of our 40th anniversary Sunday in June this year.

The faultless dinner was purchased with confidence from Ben's Roasts at Paraparaumu Beach and a roast dinner for 90 people takes some work so our thanks to Kelly and Ben. (And dare I say, they can be an excellent choice when faced with unexpected visitors. Free plug).

Sunday Lunches have also continued throughout the year as we patronise local restaurants generally once a month. This practice was not only for our socialising but also to show support for local businesses who suffered losses during the Covid shut downs. Places visited include Rosetta Café, Two fat chefs, The Waterfront and others. For the first time we recently visited Fishermans Table and that was well received by all with a promise to go back there. Unfortunately our numbers have decreased a bit. From 22 down to 14.

Where do people go?

I believe that as an ageing congregation and with many of our members living in retirement Villages etc, the social needs of some are supplied in their village and are available close to home. Also, loss of driving licences make staying round home a safe option. Some original Social Opportunities supporters have moved elsewhere to be nearer family which has also depleted our numbers. On the other hand we have a

young member, not a church member, who comes faithfully to every board games session and is trying to persuade others to come along. (He also brings in new games which makes us strain our brains in the learning process.)

There are still social events we have yet to try, however constrictions such as ability get around can be a hindrance. It is hoped to have a small group visit the Weta Cave in the near future and also a return visit to Te Papa in the warmer weather. Any suggestions of possible events are always welcomed.

Thanks also to our Women's Fellowship which arranges social events around their Special Projects; these also develop Fellowship throughout the church.

ANNUAL PROPERTY & FINANCE REPORT 2023-2024

Members of the Property and Finance Committee in 2023-2024 were: Cathy Drummond (Parish Treasurer); Carole Rudings (Committee Secretary); Sydney Mephram; Marie Smith (Waikanae); Ken Milne (Convenor).

The Committee met monthly (with the exception of October 2023), and the main foci of the meetings were:

1. THRIFTY PLACE

Harrison's Carpet and Flooring installed a Solution dyed nylon commercial carpet in THRIFTY PLACE OP SHOP. This has refreshed the Shop and been favourably commented on by regular customers. New 'Op Shop' flags are also now in use and these are easier to see.

2. RAUMATI CHURCH KITCHEN

Andy Thomson (Thomson Plumbing) and Scott Bayler (Raumati South Building [RSB]) replaced decayed woodwork, the hot water cylinder, the water piping, sink and backsplash, and under bench cupboard. Marie Smith obtained insurance funds for the damage caused by aged Dux Quest piping which burst and flooded the kitchen and Minister's meeting room.

3.RAUMATI DEFIBRILLATOR

Philips Healthcare advised in March 2024 that there was a defect with the GHeartStart AED. Raumati Church Health and Safety Officer, The Rev Robin List, worked with Philips to have this corrected. This is important not only to the Raumati Church but also to the local community as our precinct is a Community Hub for emergencies.

4.RAUMATI AND WAIKANAE EQUIPMENT INVENTORIES

Inventories have been completed for both the Raumati and Waikanae properties. Waikanae has also completed a valuation of Waikanae items.

Thanks are due to those who have assisted with this.

5.CLEANING OF RAUMATI AND WAIKANAE BUILDINGS

This is a weekly requirement including vacuuming carpets. Waikanae does not have a contract but an agreement with a local student. The Raumati contract is now with CrewCare. The exterior of both precincts has been washed down.

6.EXTERIOR PAINTING

Raumati has had cracks repaired in brickwork and plaster and repainting has been done by Glen Boyle (Kapiticoast painters).. Waikanae painting is also in process and thanks are due to Desmond Corrigan and Don Smith for their property maintenance work

7.SIGN BOARDS

Both Raumati and Waikanae precincts have had updated and refreshed signboards installed.

8.GARDEN MAINTENANCE

The Rev Robin List and Heather, as well as Liz Sutherland, Kate Foley, and Dorothy Woods help maintain the Raumati gardens. Desmond Corrigan has been playing a similar role at the Manse.

9.LIGHTING AT RAUMATI

We are indebted to Michael Foley for his regular assistance with replacing lighting bulbs and tubes, as well as repairing wiring, fittings, both internal and external.

Like the plumbing, electrical wiring and settings are increasingly showing signs of deterioration, which is not surprising given the age of the facility.

10.HEAT PUMPS AT RAUMATI

Heat pumps have been installed in the Chapel, Upstairs Lounge, and Hall. These have been well received by all the users of the Raumati facilities and thanks are due to Cathy for organising this.

11.PROPERTY INSURANCE

Insurance for the Waikanae property, and Robert Grove, which are owned by the Methodist Church of New Zealand, has been arranged. The vexed issue of the Insurance on Raumati has been sorted, when Parish Council, after much consultation, decided to lower the level of insurance from Full Replacement to Indemnity. To save further money, coverage for chattels has been cut by 50% and to eliminate coverage for Improvements. The invoice for the annual premium has not yet been received.

12.ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

In addition to those I have named, there are many other people who regularly assist our Parish and we are indebted to them.

I must, however, thank Carole Rudings for her secretarial work for Property & Finance, Cathy Drummond for her work as Treasurer, Fiona Bell for her assistance, and also my 'home' secretary, Janet.

This is the second year where we have enjoyed Women’s Fellowship Meetings and Soup Group Gatherings on alternate months. All these occasions are open for anyone to attend. Usually 4 - 7 at the Women’s Fellowship and 10-12 at the Soup Group. Both groups meet in various homes, particularly John and Diana Roberts and Marie and Don Smith, the hospitality is very much appreciated by all.

Discussions range over a wide variety of topics, services and service times, Matariki’s first public holiday, fellowship, church & community. We have looked at specific words, their origins and where we use them ,- Grace, Blessed Thankfulness, Life is for Living.

The report of the NZMWF National Convention noted that of the 80-90 women who attended 9 were Palangi. The 2022-23 Special Project recipients were the Living Wage Movement \$15,000 and \$15,000 to CWS for Relief in Tonga. Kath Turkington a member of the Kapiti Uniting Parish and longtime MWF member was remembered in the Tributes.

In November, 15+ members enjoyed a Bar-B-Q lunch at Desmond Corrigan’s home which was very much appreciated by all.

World Day of Prayer service 1st March 2024 was held at St. Michael’s Church, Waikanae. Members of our congregation attended and participated.

On 27 April 2024 the first ever Wellington Area Gathering of Methodist Women’s Groups was well attended. The NZMWF

President Lesieli Pope and 5 members of the National Executive were present. .

The 2023-24 Special Project was for the Samoan Victim Support Group in Samoa and the NZ Project “I am Hope- Gumboot Friday “ . It was decided that we would support a local mental health programme instead. “Stand Tu Maia Whanau” - Central Region. A country wide group which has evolved following the closure of the Children’s Health Camps. On Sunday 26 May women led the Special Project Service which was followed by a Soup & Rolls Lunch enjoyed by many. \$480.00 was raised for the projects
