Reflections by Syd Mepham Parish Council Retreat held in February

We are the People of God in this place.

We represent the Christian faith, expressed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

We are charged by God, to hold the values of love, peace and hope, care and healings for others, justice for all, the joy of the Christian faith and the love of God, for all to see.

Over the years we have responded to the call of God and individually, made our way here and established our presence on this knoll of land in Raumati and a corner section at Waikanae Beach.

The building we sit in today is lifted up to be seen. On its walls are two crosses that proclaim our faith. On Sunday mornings we ring a bell to announce to the neighbourhood a God-centred worship service is about to start.

Our website proclaims who we are and it tells the community what our mission is. That our mission is..."To promote Christian faith and values in the communities of the Kapiti Coast".

Further comment states that..."This ethic governs our worship and encourages our members to move out from the church into the community, giving service to others and helping address social issues".

On the face of it, it seems that we have cracked it! That it's all downhill from here on. Is it?

We have an ageing parish. We have a parish that is declining in numbers. We have a parish where the emphasis is pastoral. We have a parish that does not discuss its future.

So where can we find the God-centred vision for the Parish? For its people? For the wider community? A vision that underpins the statement of mission we proclaim.

Scripture tells us in Proverbs... "that where there is no vision, the People perish".

Having a vision and knowing our vision allows us to set our expectations for success.

It aids us in staying focussed on the path we have chosen and is consolidated in our calling, in our thinking and in our actions.

Without a vision the people perish!

- We have a stated Mission but without a tactical plan to identify the resources required to fulfil the mission!

We are confronted by a challenge; a whero is laid down before us.

People, We are challenged by our faith. We are challenged by our history. We are challenged by diminishing congregations. We are challenged by the needs of our community.

Are we willing to respond to the challenges facing us?

Let's look to the scriptures once more;

Isaiah writes..." then I heard the Lord asking... 'Who will I send to be a messenger to my People?' Isaiah spoke up and said 'I am here Lord! Send me"!
