We talked about COVID safety and we talked about personal online safety - both of which are discussion topics which raise adrenalin levels.

Our decision about COVID safety is that we will follow the Government's decision to lift mandates, such as mask wearing. I would like to make it clear, though, that mask wearing is a perfectly acceptable practice in all contact situations, from seeing Kate in the office, to attending worship.

You are welcome to wear a mask.

The decision is up to you. We encourage you to wear a mask if you have symptoms which might be transmitted to others. And of course, we encourage the use of testing and staying away if you know you are sick.

We discussed online safety because the church has been used for a recent scam which targeted some of our members. It used the Minister's identity and authority in order to defraud people. We looked at what support we should provide in this situation, how we can all become more aware of the latest scamming techniques, how we can better protect you, the people of Kapiti Uniting, and what we need to do to provide greater protection around sensitive data such as contact details.

The COVID pandemic has had a destabilising effect on people psychologically, materially and socially. This scam is just one of the many harmful patterns of behaviour which are on the increase.

Let us be grateful for the net of love which connects us safely to one another and to the world. Let us give thanks for God's protection, which never fails.






