## News from Waikanae



#### Wedding at Waikanae

A young Korean couple chose our little church for their wedding in February. The bride's father, a pastor, conducted the service, but as he is not an authorised marriage celebrant Rev Anna took care of the official requirements.

The couple donated a little painting of the church in appreciation. The church looked lovely, and the splendid appearance of the grounds (cared for by Desmond) drew approving comment.

#### Worship

We celebrated the <u>Covenant Service</u> on 4 February. It's a 250-year-old Methodist tradition which, early in each year, renews the Covenant between God and God's people.

The Covenant Prayer ends with the words : "And now, glorious God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are mine and I am yours. So be it, and the covenant now made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen." As we were close to Waitangi Day on 6 February, we also reflected on the covenant that is the Treaty of Waitangi.

Rev Anna led our worship for <u>Transfiguration Sunday</u>, a significant day before we enter into Lent.

#### Looking ahead

The Worship group, led by Sue Hodgson, is preparing for our <u>Harvest</u> <u>Festival</u> on  $3^{rd}$  March – a meaningful service for Waikanae gardeners.

Desmond Corrigan will lead the Worship group in a Lenten service on 17 March: <u>'The Road to the Cross revisited'</u>. Rev Robin List will present the <u>Palm Sunday</u> service, and <u>Easter Day</u> worship, with Holy Communion, will be led by John and Diana Roberts.

held at Raumati, prepared by Rev Anna, with a theme of 'Christians in the Middle East', have been very well attended by Waikanae members.

#### **Soup Group**

at its first meeting for the year explored the theme of Hope. Thoughtful discussion and deep sharing characterise this group of women and men. The next meeting, in April, will look at 'Grace'.

## Raumati Village Community Garden Update

Last year we were contacted by Kapiti College student Oscar, who wanted to help us in some way for his Social Studies project. On our behalf, Oscar applied for a grant from the Raumati Community Board and was successful!

In September we received the grant for \$276.35. We were down to our last few cents and the money was very welcome. It has enabled us to purchase more seedlings to get us through summer and will help us buy some more compost if required. We may also look at purchasing a hose as the current system of using a bucket is hard work and our last hose was stolen, as well as all our watering cans!

Thank you so much Oscar, we really appreciate your help and you did an excellent job applying for the grant. Thank you!



Our summer garden is looking pretty tidy and some new seedlings have been planted to get us through to the next season. We have spring onions, lettuce, bok choy, green beans, capsicum, pumpkins and tomatoes. Our main issue is keeping the garden watered, but we are trying our best. The winter garden is much easier to grow vegetables, thanks to the rain watering the garden for us!

Moving into the next season, our beds will need to be refreshed with our compost and we will need to keep on top of the weeds. It would be great if we can try again to plant some rhubarb. Rhubarb is a heavy feeder but does look after itself and it will provide a continuing harvest.



If you have any rhubarb crowns you are digging up over the coming months, we would love them planted in the corner, next to the compost. Thank you!



In the meantime, please enjoy the garden and weeding and watering is always welcome.
